

Christian Colleges Rank High for Student Engagement

The Wall Street Journal/Times Higher Education College Rankings measure several factors, including student engagement. This was determined mainly through surveys and, the *Wall Street Journal* reports, “monitors how challenged and inspired students feel inside and outside the classroom, as well as the breadth of courses their schools offer.”

Among the colleges and universities with the highest student engagement, nine of the top 12 are faith-based:
